Each subgroup (Assistive technologies, Interaction design, Digital communication and culture) is responsible for arranging two seminars. Below are some possible formats.

- PhD seminars in which one or more PhD students outline his or her research agenda, current challenges or problems. It could also be in the format of presenting a contribution to a journal or a conference. The seminar can be considered as inspiration for other researchers as well as supplementary supervision and constructive criticism for the PhD students.
- Resarch project seminars in which one or more project members present the current status or an interesting aspect of a specific research project. It could also be in the format of presenting a contribution to a journal or a conference. Finally it could be a proposal for a research project.
- **Guest seminars** in which external guests are invited to give a presentation. These could either be from industry or from other research environments. Hot shots or just interesting people.
